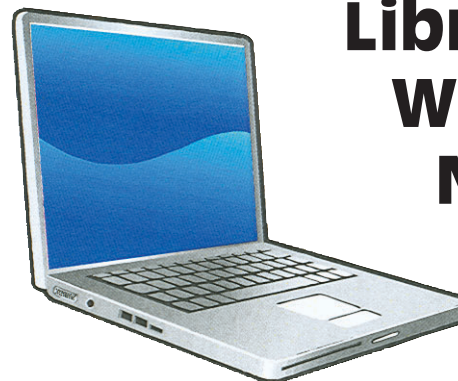

Important Access Information

- The wireless service is open public access. Users should use caution with confidential data and utilize the available service at their own risk. **No password or login is required.**
- The library is not responsible for any changes to personal laptops resulting from connection to the wireless network or for damage, theft, loss of equipment, software or data files.
- Library staff cannot provide assistance to troubleshoot your equipment. Staff can assist in finding information to allow you to fix your computer.
- Wireless access in the library is filtered. To access the Internet, please read and accept the library's "Internet Acceptable Use Policy".
- Wireless access is available in most areas of the library; however, you may have to reconnect if you move from one area to another. Wireless is also available in library conference rooms and the Lounge.
- Wireless is not available in some designated areas of the library, such as the Quiet Room. Please check at the reference desk if you fail to get a signal.
- You may plug your laptop into electrical outlets in the library. Please take care that the cord does not extend across walkways or cause a tripping hazard.

Connecting to the Library Wireless Network



IN most cases, using the wireless connection at the library will **not** require you to make adjustments to your computer. If you regularly connect to other wireless networks or you have a new computer, you may have to tell your computer what network to connect to.

YOU will need to have a laptop computer with a wireless card with 802.11b or 802.11g network compatibility. This is the standard and most newer computers will have this.

To connect to the library wireless network, please follow instructions below for Macintosh:

Macintosh OS 8 & 9

1. Select **Apple Menu > Control Panel > TCP/IP**
2. Connect via **AirPort** or other wireless (WiFi) Ethernet
3. Configure **Using DHCP Server**
4. Leave Name Server and Additional Search domains blank

Macintosh OS X

1. Select **Apple Menu > System Preferences > Network button**
2. Select **TCP/IP** tab and configure **Using DHCP** (above the TCP/IP tab, you may need to configure via AirPort or other wireless (WiFi) Ethernet)
3. Leave Domain Name Servers and Search Domains blank

To connect to the library wireless network, please follow instructions below for Windows:

Windows Vista

1. Click on round Windows logo (formerly the Start button)
2. Click **Connect To** in right hand panel (in the “connect to a network” box)
3. Click on network you wish to connect to (see table above)
4. Click **Connect**
5. Window informs you that “*LBFIC (for example)* is an unsecured network”
6. Click on **Connect Anyway** (Please note: If asked for a network type select **private**)
7. **Do not check** “Save this network”
8. Click **close**
9. Open your browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, etc.) or click refresh button (or F5) in your browser

Windows XP

1. Click **Start**
2. Click **Connect To**
3. Click **Wireless Network Connection**
4. Click **View Wireless Networks**
5. Click on network you wish to connect to (see table on previous page)
6. Click **Connect**
7. Open your browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, etc.) or click refresh button (or F5) in your browser
