Which eBook devices will work with the collection?

Kindle, Nook, Sony, Pandigital, Literati, Kobo iPad, iPhone, iPod, BlackBerry, and Android systems (with the Overdrive app)

Who can use Midland's eBook collection?

Residents of the City of Midland and residents of the following Midland County townships:

Edenville, Greendale, Homer, Hope, Ingersoll, Jerome, Larkin, Lee, Lincoln, Midland, Mills, Mt. Haley

If you live in other areas, you may have access to the eBook collections of your home library.

Are eBooks always available?

No, when an eBook is checked out, it is unavailable until returned. You will be able to place a hold and receive a notice when the title is available.

How many eBooks can I check out?

Two per library card number, until the collection is larger.

How long can I loan the eBooks?

You can choose 14 or 21 days.

Can I renew my eBook?

No

What happens when my eBook is due?

The eBook license will return to Overdrive and the title will be available to someone else. The file still will remain on your eReader but you will no longer be able to open the title. Delete the item on your device.
