### RESIDENT RESPONSE SURVEY RESULTS

City staff estimates there were about 1600 members in the audience.

658 total surveys returned (~41% of audience)

- 602 surveys from city residents
- 56 surveys from either non-city residents or from persons who did not include name address.

#### Of the 602 surveys returned by city residents:

I am satisfied with the process that the MDEQ has presented on the dioxin issue and believe that they are adequately addressing my concerns.

I believe the City Council should continue to seek a dioxin health/exposure study prior to the implementation of additional soil testing.

**Of the 56 surveys returned by those outside of the city and those who did not provide a name/address:**

I am satisfied with the process that the MDEQ has presented on the dioxin issue and believe that they are adequately addressing my concerns.
