## 24 Kaufman Park

Located centrally between Bloomfield Dr., Brookfield Dr., Foxcroft Dr., and Westbury Dr.

Kaufman Park is a 10.8-acre neighborhood park with a variety of amenities to please everyone. The greater part of the park is open play fields and areas of shade trees. The north side of the park offers play equipment, volleyball poles, grills, and benches. Conversely, the south side of the park is an undeveloped wooded area with trails.



## 25 Adams Park

Located adjacent to Adams Elementary School on Adams Dr. off Jefferson Ave.

Set behind Adams School playground, this 7.4-acre undeveloped park is perfect for nature lovers. This wooded area is the ideal place to observe wildlife and a variety of vegetation.

## 26 Birchwood Park

Located centrally between Parkwood Dr., Farnsworth Dr., Westbury Dr., and Foxcroft Dr.

Birchwood Park is a 1.6-acre undeveloped park hidden between neighborhood houses. A secret to most, the park is a hotspot for neighborhood kids who find the hilly terrain and trails cut through trees the ideal location for sledding and mountain biking.

## 27 Blake Park

Located across from Stratford Woods Park on E. Ashman St. 1/4 mile east of Waldo Ave.

Blake Park is best known for being home to the two Ashman softball fields, often used in Midland league play. However, more than just softball fields, this park also contains 45.5-acres of undeveloped area. Here, visitors will find a mixture of deciduous trees and tall grasses – the perfect place for a light afternoon hike.

## 28 Briarwood Park

Located centrally between Lambros Dr., Greenbrier Ter., Canterbury Dr., and Lawndale Dr.

With 7.4-acres of open play area, Briarwood Park is an excellent spot for neighborhood children to have fun. The park is surrounded by a thin forest, and offers visitors two areas of play equipment, a soccer field, and a paved basketball court. A portion of the park is also flooded in the winter to create a rink for pickup hockey games.

## 29 Burlington Park

Located between Burlington Dr. and Plymouth St.

Tucked away between neighborhood streets, Burlington Park is a 2.8-acre area surrounded by a light forest. In a neighborhood with many small children, the park is usually bustling with activity on summer afternoons. The park offers a basketball court, play equipment, open fields, and a bench.

## 30 Chatham Park

Located on Chatham Dr. off E. Meadowbrook Dr.

Chatham Park is a simple park that offers enough to keep children entertained for hours. The 1.8-acre park has plenty of open space, play equipment, and a softball field.

## 31 Chestnut Hill Park

Located adjacent to Chestnut Hill Elementary School on Chestnut Hill Dr. off E. Sugnet Rd.

Chestnut Hill Park is a 4.2-acre natural forest area. During the summer months, the dense coverage makes it a popular location for games of capture the flag and hide and seek. During the winter, its hilly terrain is perfect for sledding.

## 32 Glenoak Park

Located centrally between E. Sugnet Rd., Boston St., Cambridge St., and Hartford Ct.

Visitors enjoy Glenoak Park for its seclusion and privacy. This 1.2-acre square park is hidden behind neighborhood houses. Once found, however, guests can enjoy open play fields and various play equipment.

## 33 Greenfield Park

Located at the end of Greenfield Ct. off E. Sugnet Rd. 1/4 mile west of Washington St.

Greenfield Park is a true family recreation area, as it offers something for people of all ages. For Midland's youngest residents, the park has baby swings and a sandbox. There are play fields and various equipment for slightly older children. For teens, the park is home to a softball field and a paved basketball court. Parents will enjoy relaxing on park benches or playing with their children in this multifaceted park.

## 34 Hillgrove Park

Located on Hillgrove Pkwy., 1/4 mile east of Swede Ave.

Hillgrove Park is a beautiful 4.4-acre neighborhood recreation area. The majority of the park is open play fields spotted sporadically with trees. Visitors will also find a basketball hoop and play equipment.

## 35 Longacres Park

Located on E. St. Andrews St. between Boston St. and Dartmouth Dr.

Longacres Park is a favorite among soccer fans, as it is one of the few Midland parks that has two soccer goals complete with nets. In addition, this 3.5-acre neighborhood park has a basketball court, play equipment and open play areas.
