Program schedules for MCTV-3, MGTV-5, and MPS-TV 17 are published in the Midland Daily News Sunday TV Times, and are listed on the City of Midland website at www.midland-mi.org.

There are four access channels on Charter Communications cable system in the city of Midland:



MGTV-5 - Midland Government TV: Programs and messages submitted by the City of Midland and other government agencies. Programs include City Council meetings, meetings of the City's boards and commissions, and "City in 15," a monthly show about City news and services. Most MGTV-5 programming can also be viewed online via **streaming video**, offered on the City's website (www.midland-mi.org).

MGTV-5 is also part of the City's emergency notification system. Weather warnings, emergency situations, and other events impacting residents may be posted on MGTV-5. Call 989-837-3304 with any questions.



MCTV-3 - Community Voices: Programs produced or submitted by Midland County residents. Program examples include talk shows, sports, church services, and concerts. Training in video production is offered several times each year, and a \$25 annual fee is charged for MCTV equipment use or program submittal.

MCTV-15 - Messages: Announcements submitted by the public to promote non-profit events and services. Messages can be submitted using an interactive form on the City's website (www.midland-mi.org). Don't have Internet access? Call MCTV to find out how to submit your message. Public access programming also airs on MCTV-15. There is a \$25 annual fee to utilize this service.



MPS-TV 17 - Midland Public Schools: Programs and messages submitted by the Midland Public Schools. Programs include school board meetings, school concerts, sports and a monthly series on MPS programs and services called "MPS Today". Call 989-923-5001 for more information on MPS-TV.

MCTV office hours are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. The facility is open for access users most weeknights and Saturdays. MCTV is located on the lower level of the Grace A. Dow Memorial Library, 1710 W. St. Andrews.

Midland Fire Department (989) 837-3410

Burning Regulations... Recreational fires are permitted within the city limits. Fires must be no more than three feet in diameter and three feet high. Please remember to use clean firewood only. Burning leaves, brush, trash, or garbage is prohibited. All recreational fires should be kept at least 25 feet away from any building. Keep a shovel, garden hose, or fire extinguisher with a minimum 4A rating available to extinguish the fire if necessary. All fires must be constantly attended by a responsible person.

Emergency Siren Tests... Tests of the emergency warning siren system are conducted on a routine basis. A short, weekly "growl test" occurs every Saturday at 12:45 p.m. The full monthly test of the siren system takes place at 12:45 p.m. on the first Saturday of each month. The tests ensure the sirens are functioning properly.
