

# Snow Removal & Response

Snow response and removal throughout Midland's 35+ square miles depends upon the amount of snow that falls. Below are general guidelines for snow removal in the city of Midland.

## Salting Operations

When conditions of light snow or ice appear on road surfaces, City of Midland work crews begin to salt priority routes. Priority routes include the following:

- bridges
- overpasses
- the Business Route 10 expressway
- state trunk lines
- major streets
- the hospital zone

## Street Plowing

When a snowfall of four (4) inches or more occurs, and/or accompanying weather conditions warrant, street plowing begins. Once priority routes have been cleared, the road crews begin plowing residential areas, starting with the next day's garbage collection route and continuing through the days of the week. For example: If snowfall stops on Monday, the road crew would begin plowing in the areas scheduled for Tuesday collection and would then proceed to plow through the areas scheduled for collection on Wednesday, etc.

# Landfill Disposal Information

Hours of Operation: Monday-Friday 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.

From March-November only, Saturday hours available: 8:30 a.m. - Noon

Each month, Midland County residents may dispose of up to three cubic yards of refuse for free during one landfill visit. Residents must present a current drivers license or property tax bill to verify residency. There will be a fee for any excess yardage based on material type and estimated quantity (see chart below).

No liquid or household hazardous waste will be accepted; however, the landfill will accept dried Latex paint in the can, with the lid off.

## Household Hazardous & Electronic Waste Collection

Some household hazardous materials can lead to contamination of groundwater, well water, or other water sources when spilled onto the ground, poured down the drain, or placed in the trash. To prevent this, the Midland County Health Department sponsors a free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program several times each year that provides residents with an opportunity to safely and properly dispose of most such materials in the home including automotive products, cleaning products, and paint and garden products.

Electronic waste disposal days are also offered intermittently. On these days, residents may dispose of items such as computers and monitors, cell phones, old thermometers, and other items containing mercury. For information, call the Health Department at 989-832-6681.

## Residential Waste Disposal

A convenient residential waste disposal site near the landfill entrance is paved and elevated so residents can drive up to the area and unload items into large dumpsters that are nearly flush with the ground. This area allows residents to forgo having to enter landfill cells to dispose of their refuse.

Appliances .....	\$7 each
